Bob Wingfield, Keith and Kim Waller traveled to Cap Haitien to gather information this past July! It was a quick trip but filled with all kinds of golden nuggets! Our main goal was to discuss future plans for a Seminary in this area of the country as it is safer for teaching and learning the Word of God!

It was an exciting adventure we were all honored to be a part of! We were able to talk with Pastor Eliona Bernard for hours on each day we were there as he gave us answers to the many questions Bob had carefully put together! On our final day we had a meeting with the architect! Pastor Marky (who flew in from Jacmel) and Pastor Gergens (who we met last January) surprised us by joining the meeting, showing their great support for a desperately needed Seminary! PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear friends in Christ and friends of Haiti,

Genesis 15, vs. 5-6 - "He took him outside and said, Look up at the heavens and count the stars - if indeed you can count them". Then He said to him, 'so shall your offspring be'. Abraham believed the Lord, and He credited it to him as righteousness."

This incident with Abram reminded me of a few things - the hymn "Earth and All Stars"; the old ditty - star light, star bright, first star I see tonight, I wish I may, I wish I might, have the wish I wish tonight; Jiminy Cricket - "when you wish upon a star, makes no difference who you are, when you wish upon a star, your dreams come true".

I'm not sure Abram was wishing, but he certainly could have been wondering. God promised that He would bring forth from Abram a great nation. God has promised that in him, all the nations of the world would be blessed through his Seed. The problem - no offspring, no son to be found, no chance of a barren wife to bear that son. And the biological clocks were ticking. Time was running out and no heir to inherit anything.

Twice in this section we read - "The Word of the Lord came to Abram". That's all Abram got - no special sign, no outward proof - just an invitation to look at the stars, followed by a sure promise in God's Word. In a seemingly impossible situation, with fear controlling his thoughts, Abram hears God's promise - "this one shall not be your heir, but one that will come from your own body"

Impossible situations. God asks us to trust and believe. In our limited human perspective, lots of what God's Word says seems impossible - creating the (continued page 3)

universe in six, ordinary days; a worldwide flood and an ark that preserved animals, Noah, and his family; the all-powerful God stooping down to put on our flesh and blood, entering our dying world to die for the world's sins; faith given and new life given to one dead in trespasses and sin; Jesus rising from the dead and our resurrection on the last day.

Fearful situations. God asks us to trust and believe. God knows what plagues us, what fears and questions we have, what hurts and haunts us. The devil, the world, and our flesh would like us to see our situation with our earthly eyes and mind and take our eyes off of Jesus. There is nothing God has not dealt with in Christ. God has promised to be with us, to never leave us or forsake us. Fear is not of God.

We may have only a sense of what our Haitian brothers and sisters are experiencing. We know the daily temptations and challenges of our own life. We all may see our situation as one with no solution. Fear is brought on as we use logic and reason, senses and emotions to figure things out. God already has things figured out. So, with Abram and all the saints, we hear, "Fear not, I am with you."

It's not about wishing on a star or wishing things were better or different or less stressful. It's about a Word from God that promises He is the God of the impossible in which there is no fear. "Be still and know that I am God."

Pastor Thomas - letter - August 31, 2023

Brothers, Sisters and Friends in Christ,

Hearty greetings in the name of the King of kings, Jesus Christ whose blood cleanses us from all sins and iniquities! We give thanks unto the Lord for all the blessings received from Him and most importantly for the forgiveness of our sins.

I pray this letter finds you well as our Heavenly Father continues to preserve and keep us in true faith so that in all circumstances we continue to praise and give thanks to Him. We always feel disturbed to mention in each letter we send out the crucial situation of the country. We would prefer to share things that motivate us to give thanks to God. Unfortunately, that is not the case. Most of the time our letters break your heart and make you sad. Sometimes we might even think that God forgets His promises. But God always knows what He is doing; He never forgets his promises. His loving concern for his people moves him to take appropriate action at the right time.

As you may learn in the news, the current situation is very complex, but no matter what, God is in control. In this time of distress, we focus on God's Word and his promises. As we are battling with this socio-politico situation, we know that God will step in and put all things under his feet. As Christian leaders, we encourage our members to remain faithful in times of suffering and hardships because through suffering we may be equipped to comfort others. Even in a time of suffering, God is still our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in time of trouble (psalm 46:1). Our God still reigns. Alleluia. We gave thanks to God that (continued page 6)

despite the socio-politico situation that has impacted the Haitian Community, we can worship regularly. However, we often need to shorten our evening services just to one hour on Wednesday for prayer meetings and Friday for Bible study. Most of the activities such as business meetings, choir rehearsal, and visitation take place on Sunday. Some Sundays we even eat at the church. Because of the current situation, a few family members from our church left the country to go and live overseas which affects church attendance and our congregation.

As for our school, we are getting ready for the reopening on September 11, 2023. We have a pleasant number of students, and it seems the number of students may increase from 500 to 550 for this academic school year (2023-



2024). This increase is mainly due to the relocation of families in surrounding neighborhoods as the social conditions and cost of living continue to escalate.

What a privilege and opportunity to be able to share the good news of salvation and teach all these students in the Luther's Small Catechism! By doing so, we are not only building character for the future generation but also the Kingdom of God. As always, our consecrating and thanksgiving ceremony will be held on the first Monday of October 2023, to dedicate the school year to God.

We thank each of you for your continuous prayers and support. By doing so, you help us to better serve the community and carry out the mission entrusted to us which is to go and make disciples...(Matthew 28: 19-20).

Coming from an accounting background, including a CPA license, university academic teaching, and industrial CFO experience, Gordon has combined his vocational skills with Godly wisdom regarding the direction of the HLMS. Over the years many events, both joyful

and sorrowful, have filled the efforts of the HLMS, including the use of capital expenditures and on-going budget support to joyfully recognize God's hand in this ministry, along with the untimely and sorrowful physical deaths of several of God's Haiti Lutheran servants as they were used by God to impact the eternal lives of the individuals they served. Gordon has been alongside of them, in prayer and support, including traveling to Haiti. God is now leading Gordon to 'retire' from his position as HLMS Assistant Treasurer and Member of the HLMS Board of Directors in October, although we know his heart will always be 'working' before God on behalf of the Haitian students, families, schools, and churches.
